### 7. Competition Category

- 1. The competition is divided into six major groups, with 100 questions in each category.
- 2. The questions are primarily based on Tales of Joy, Magic Joy, and the Word Power section from issues 298-309 of *Joy to the World* magazine. The scope of the questions is determined according to the corresponding proficiency level for each category.

# 8. Registration Instructions and Competition Guidelines

Mock Competition	All contestants registered for the regional competition are eligible to participate in the mock competition.			
Regional Competition	<ul> <li>Registration is conducted online and handled by branch schools on behalf of the contestants. Each category is limited to three contestants per school, and individual registrations are not accepted.</li> <li>Contestants must register based on their proficiency level as of Friday, August 29.</li> <li>For special cases such as early enrollment, late enrollment, or cross-level study, please register based on the desired proficiency level first.         After registration, submit a tuition payment proof to the organizing committee for review. Once verified, the contestant's birth information will be adjusted in the system accordingly.     </li> <li>Students who have completed TJ8 and are currently enrolled in MJ5 must register for Group B. ### **Notes for Competition**

- Contestants who do not attend the competition will forfeit their participation.
   Substitutes who were not officially registered will not be allowed to compete.
- After the registration deadline, the organizing committee will conduct eligibility verification. The following violations will result in disqualification:
  - 1. Contestants registering for the wrong category, such as a higher-level student registering for a lower-level category or vice versa.
  - 2. Using another school's quota to register.
  - 3. Replacing a contestant after the registration deadline.
  - 4. Competing on behalf of another person (contestant impersonation).
  - 5. Participating from home or any unauthorized location instead of the designated competition venue.
- If a branch school is found to have violated the above rules, the following penalties will apply:
  - 1. If discovered before the competition, the contestant's qualification will be revoked, and the branch school cannot replace them with another contestant.
  - 2. If discovered after the competition, both the contestant and the branch school will be disqualified from awards and rankings. Any received awards will be revoked, and the next highest-scoring contestant will move up in ranking and receive the award.
  - 3. The violation will be publicly announced in the competition bulletin.

# Mock Competition

- This takes place before the regional competitions. Contestants make use of the mock competition to familiarize themselves with the online computer-based competition method.
- It is recommended to take the test online at the branch school using a physical keyboard for input. If technical limitations prevent the test from being conducted at the branch school, an alternative venue may be arranged by the branch school as a unit. Individual participation from home or other locations is strictly prohibited.
- Please use the same location and setup for both the mock competition and regional competition in order to achieve the goal of having mock competitions.

- Contestants are strictly prohibited from participating individually at home or any unauthorized location. Violations will result in disqualification.
- Mobile devices such as phones and tablets are not allowed for answering questions in neither the mock competition nor the regional competition.
- On the day of the competition, contestants are not allowed to bring dictionaries, electronic dictionaries, translation devices, translation pens, smartwatches, mobile phones, or other electronic devices.
- During the competition, looking around, talking to others, or any form of cheating is strictly prohibited.
- Important notice: Each competition account can only be logged in once.
- Do not refresh or close the window during the test. Doing so will prevent you from logging back into the competition page and continuing the test.
- The test should be taken in a quiet and secure space within the branch school, free from distractions. A stable Internet connection must be ensured. If technical issues such as computer crashes or network disconnections occur and disrupt the test, the branch school will be responsible for handling the situation.

### Important Notes

- If the competition cannot be conducted at the branch school due to equipment limitations, an alternative venue may be arranged as a unit of the branch school. Individual participation from home or other locations is strictly prohibited.

The competition consists of two rounds and is conducted in English:
 Round 1—Listen and Write Elimination Round. The top six contestants with the most correct answers advance to the next round.

 Round 2—Listen and Answer Round.

- Contestants who do not check in by the designated time will be considered to have forfeited.
- Contestants are required to wear the Joy red T-shirt during the competition. Failure to do so will result in a five-point deduction from their total score.
- Contestants are not allowed to say their school name or their own name on stage. Any violation will result in disqualification.



- Teachers and parents are not allowed to give any hand gestures or verbal reminders to the contestants in the preparation area or during the competition. No second person is allowed to participate or echo the content of the contestant's performance. Any violation will result in disqualification.
- To avoid disturbing the contestants, children aged six and under (including six years old) are not allowed to enter the competition venue. Photography and videography are prohibited during the competition. If individuals do not comply with the staff's request, they will be asked to leave the competition venue.

Answering Method	<ul> <li>The contestants will write the word they hear on a tablet or whiteboard and show their answer within ten seconds.</li> </ul>
Scoring Method	<ul> <li>The winner will be determined by the number of correct answers after all 15 questions.</li> <li>The top six contestants will advance to the second round, the Listen and Answer Round.</li> <li>In case of a tie, the competition will continue until the top six contestants are determined.</li> </ul>
Notes	<ul> <li>The following situations will be considered incorrect answers and will not be scored: <ol> <li>(1) Answering before the prompt is completed.</li> <li>(2) Not showing the answer or failing to show the answer within ten seconds.</li> <li>(3) Spelling errors.</li> <li>(4) Incorrect capitalization format (except for proper nouns, all words should start with lowercase letters).</li> <li>(5) Illegible handwriting that makes it impossible for the judges to determine the answer.</li> <li>(6) Exhibiting distracting behavior, such as looking around or turning back, during the competition.</li> <li>(7) Errors in line breaks, with scoring guidelines as follows: <ol> <li>Do not split a word across lines (e.g., "oran" on one line, "ge" on the next).</li> </ol> </li> <li>Words can be split across lines (e.g., "hot" on one line, "dog" on the next), but do not split a word itself.</li> </ol></li></ul>
	Listen and Answer Round
Question Format	Contestants will draw their order of answering before stepping onto the stage and will draw their questions on stage in sequence. In each round, each contestant will answer one question. When all six



	<ul> <li>contestants have answered once, it will be considered one round, and there will be a total of ten rounds.</li> <li>After the question is presented, a one-minute countdown will begin for the contestant to answer. A bell will ring one time at 50 seconds as a reminder, and two times at the end of one minute.</li> <li>Within the 50 seconds, contestants may request the announcer to: <ul> <li>(1) Repeat the word (e.g., "Can you repeat the word?")</li> <li>(2) Use the word in a sentence (e.g., "Can you use the word in a sentence?")</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Answering Method	<ul> <li>The contestant's answering method is as follows: Word + Spelling + Word (e.g., joy, j-o-y, joy).</li> <li>(1) When answering, the volume should be loud enough, and each letter must be clearly pronounced for the judges to recognize.</li> <li>(2) If the contestant answers within 50 seconds, the announcer will ask whether it's the final answer (e.g., "Is that your final answer?"). The contestant may choose to revise their answer before confirming. Once the contestant confirms with "YES" that it's their final answer, they can leave the microphone and return to their seat (without waiting for the full one-minute time).</li> <li>(3) If the contestant answers after 50 seconds and doesn't confirm their answer, the last answer given will be considered the final answer.</li> </ul>
Scoring Method	<ul> <li>After 10 rounds, the results will be calculated based on the number of correct answers. The contestant with the most correct answers will be the winner.</li> <li>If there is a tie, an overtime round will be held until a champion is determined (2nd and 3rd place may be tied).</li> </ul>
Notes	<ul> <li>The following situations will be considered incorrect answers and will not be scored: <ol> <li>Failure to answer in the required format.</li> <li>Spelling errors.</li> <li>Not answering or failing to answer within one minute.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Answering with a volume too low or unclear speech, making it impossible for the judges to assess.</li> </ul>

### **Tiebreaker Round**

- Contestants will answer in order. The correct answer will allow the contestant to proceed to the next round, while an incorrect answer will result in immediate elimination (those eliminated in the same round will share the same rank).
- If all contestants in a round answer incorrectly, they will all retain their qualification and proceed to the next round.
- If only one contestant answers correctly in a round, they may challenge the champion word. If the challenge is successful, they will become the champion of the competition. If the challenge fails, they will continue to compete with the contestant s who answered incorrectly in the previous round.
